EU strikes deal with Turkey to return migrants

The European Union (EU) on Friday finalised a deal with Turkey, wherein all migrants arriving in Greece will be sent back to Turkey starting Sunday.

 In return, Turkey's EU membership talks will be reopened and the €3-billion migrant fund to Turkey will be disbursed quickly. The EU will also resettle up to 72,000 Syrian migrants in Turkey to the EU

India to set up Rabindranath Tagore Memorial in Sri Lanka

As part of its development partnership with Sri Lanka in the field of higher education, India will set up a Rabindranath Tagore Memorial Auditorium in the University of Ruhuna at Matara in South Sri Lanka.

 The award to build the auditorium was handed over to a local company in Colombo today in presence of High Commissioner of India Mr. Y.K. Sinha, State Secretary, Ministry of Higher Education of Sri Lanka Mr. D.G. Hapuarachchi and Vice-Chancellor, University of Ruhuna Prof. Gamini Senanayake.

Mauritania ratified 2014 Protocol to the Forced Labour Convention

Mauritania on 14 March 2016 became the second African country to ratify the 2014 Protocol to the Forced Labour Convention 1930.

- Prior to Mauritania, Niger (Africa), Norway (Europe) and the United Kingdom (Europe) ratified the protocol.
- The protocol requires States to take effective measures for prevention of forced labour, protection of victims and ensuring their access to justice and compensation.
- The ILO estimates that about 21 million men, women, and children are in forced labour – trafficked, held in debt bondage, or working under slave-like conditions.

UN suspended Maria Sharapova as goodwill ambassador after doping allegations

The United Nations formally suspended relationship with Russian Tennis great Maria Sharapova as a goodwill ambassador after she failed a drug test at the Australian Open.

 Sharapova tested positive for meldonium at the Australian Open and has been provisionally suspended from tennis





pending an independent panel ruling on the case.

• She had started the role with the UN Development Programme in 2007, with a special focus on helping with the recovery efforts after the 1986 Chernobyl nuclear disaster.

World Consumer Rights Day observed

Every year World Consumer Rights Day (WCRD) is being observed on 15 March for celebration and solidarity within the international consumer movement.

- WCRD is observed on 15 March to commemorate the historic address given by the then US President John F Kennedy to the US congress in 1962.
- Antibiotics off the menu" is the theme of 2016, World Consumer Rights Day

Bangladesh's bank governor resigns on \$81 million cyber theft

In Bangladesh, the Reserve Bank Governor Atiur Rahman has resigned following a \$ 80 million cyber theft from the Bank's Reserve Fund Account at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York.

 Unknown hackers breached the computer systems of Bangladesh Bank on Feb 4 and wire-transferred around \$ 80 million from the Bank's Reserve Fund with the Federal Reserve Bank of New York to accounts of several casinos in Philippines and Sri Lanka. Experts say this is the biggest known bank theft in modern times.

Mother Teresa to be made a saint on Sept 4

Mother Teresa of Calcutta, a nun who dedicated her life to helping the poor, will be made a saint of the Roman Catholic Church at a ceremony on Sept. 4, Pope Francis announced today.

 Last December, he cleared the way for sainthood for the Nobel peace laureate, who died in 1997 at the age of 87 and was known as "saint of the gutters".

ExoMars 2016 spacecraft successfully launched by Europe & Russia

An unmanned spacecraft named ExoMars 2016 was successfully launched jointly Europe and Russia to search for biosignatures on Mars (or Martian life) in past or present.

• The spacecraft was launched on a Proton-M rocket operated by Russia's Roscosmos from Baikonur, Kazakhstan.

Htin Kyaw elected as first civilian President of Myanmar

Myanmar's Parliament elected Htin Kyaw (69) as the first civilian (non-military) President of the country after 53 years of military rule.

 He will replace Thein Sein as President who will step down at the end of March 2016 i.e. after end of five years of army-backed rule.

China plans to land probe on Mars in 2021

China plans to land a probe on Mars in 2021 that coincide with the 100th anniversary of founding of the ruling communist Party of china and a decade after its first failed mission in 2011.





• China is likely to initiate a Mars probe in 2020, after many months flying the probe to land in the Mars

South Korea, US began largest ever military exercises

The US and South Korean troops on 7 March 2016 began their largest ever military exercises off the coast of the Korean peninsula.

- The 8-week long drill will involve about 300000 South Korean troops and 15000 US personnel.
- Meanwhile, North Korea has warned South Korea and US of indiscriminate and preemptive nuclear strikes if the two allies go further with the drills. The threat from Pyongyang follows its leader Kim Jong-Un's order last week asking country's nuclear arsenal to be placed on standby for use at any moment against the South.

 The Food and Agriculture Organization's Crop Prospects and Food Situation report said conflicts in Iraq, Syria, Yemen, Somalia, and the Central African Republic.

Pak launches probe into MQM's alleged ties with RAW

Pakistan Government has initiated probe into Karachi-based Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM) party's Alleged ties with New Delhi based Research Analysis Wing (RAW) to destabilise the country.

- The Allegations levelled against India's RAW gave money to the MQM party to destabilise Pakistan, India has dismissed the allegations levelled against it.

- It is conducted on a reciprocal basis with first edition in India ,second edition in Indonesia and so on.

Union Cabinet approved MoU between India and Bahrain on Cooperation for Prevention of Human Trafficking

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between India and Bahrain on cooperation for prevention of human trafficking especially trafficking in women and children,,rescue, recovery, repatriation and reintegration of victims of trafficking has been approved by the Union Government.

 Decision in this regard taken by the Union Cabinet headed by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The approved MoU is expected to be signed during the Home Minister visit to Bangkok in the April.

EIU Ranked Mumbai and Bangalore among Cheapest cities to live

Mumbai and Bangalore are among the cheapest cities in the world, according to a top London forecast group (EIU).Lusaka is the cheapest city to live in the world.

 London was sixth and New Yorkis seventh. Though Singapore was the most expensive, the cost of living there was 10 per cent cheaper when compared to New York than was the case in the EIU survey a year ago.

Arab League declares Lebanese movement Hezbollah a terrorist group

The Arab League has declared Lebanese movement Hezbollah a terrorist group the decision came during an Arab League foreign ministers' meeting at the organisation's headquarters in Egypt's capital Cairo.



- Nearly all 22 Arab League members supported the decision, apart from Lebanon and Iraq which expressed reservations in the foreign ministers meeting.
- The Revolutionary Guards created Hezbollah in the 1980s. Funded by Iran, it is the only side not to have put down weapons after Lebanon's civil war from 1975 to 1990.

4th World Congress of Biosphere Reserves inaugurated at Lima

4th World Congress of Biosphere Reserves was inaugurated on 14 March 2016 at Lima in Peru. The event will be held from 14 March to 17 March 2016 to address different issues related to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Post 2015 Development Agenda.

It is a world meeting of the Committees of UNESCO's Man and the Biosphere Program (MAB) and experts directly involved in the practical implementation of biosphere reserves including representatives of governments, biosphere reserves, local communities, UN agencies, NGOs, academic institutions, and organizations and institutions from all over the world working with the MAB Programme.

Hashim Thaci elected as President of Kosovo

Foreign Minister Hashim Thaci has been elected as president of Kosovo by the Members of Parliament amid the protests. He succeeded Atifete Jahjaga as head of state after winning the required simple majority in voting held in Pristina.

Peru declared emergency after oil spill Hits Rivers

 The SC had earlier ruled that the advertisements could only have pictures of the President, Prime Minister and the Chief Justice of India. The earlier order was aimed at removing the association between government policy and politicians.

Internet cut in Rohtak over Jat unrest concerns

The Haryana government has blocked internet services in Rohtak as a precautionary measure over concerns of a fresh Jat agitation in the state.

 Jat leaders had on Monday given a 72-hour ultimatum to the government, threatening to resume protests if reservation is not granted to them. The state government has

Surat, Beas India's cleanest railway stations

The Surat railway station has been named the cleanest in India in the A1 category while Beas was named the cleanest in A category by a survey conducted by the Indian Railways.

 The survey, conducted across 407 stations and based on the feedback of around 1.34 lakh passengers, classified the stations into 'A' and 'A1' categories based on their traffic.

India to host 8th BRICS Summit, 2016

The external affairs ministry has notified that India will host the 8th BRICS Summit from 15 October to 16 October 2016 in Goa.

 Chairmanship –India assumed chairmanship of BRICS from Russia on 15 February 2016 and it will last till 31 December 2016.

Cabinet approves Udaan scheme till 2019-20

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has given its approval for extension of time period of the "Special Industry Initiative for J&K" (SII J&K) Udaan scheme till 2019-20.

- Initially, the time period of Udaan was up to 2015-16.
- Udaan provides exposure to the youth of Jammu and Kashmir to the best of corporate India and corporate India to the rich talent pool available in the State. So far,





67 leading corporates have partnered with National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) under Udaan with a commitment to train youth from the state covering Organized Retail, Banking, Financial Services, IT, ITES, Infrastructure, Hospitality etc.

- More than 19,000 candidates have been selected, more than 15,000 have joined training, out of them, 8700 candidates have completed training and 6,838 have been offered jobs.
- It is expected that the target of the scheme, to train and enhance employability of 40,000 graduates, post graduates and three year engineering diploma holders, will be achieved by 2019-20.

Central Government amends Atal Pension Yojana(APY)

Central Government has amended Atal Pension Yojana (APY) to give an option to the spouse to continue to contribute for balance period on premature death of the subscriber.

- According to the amendment, the spouse of the subscriber shall be entitled to receive the same pension amount as that of the subscriber until the death of the spouse.
- After the death of both the subscriber and the spouse, the nominee of the subscriber shall be entitled to receive the pension wealth, as accumulated till age of 60 years of the subscriber.

DRDO develops RADAR to look through walls

The Indian Army gets its first Thermal based RADAR technology that will enable to look through the walls.

- Developed by: LRDE(Electronics & Radar Development Establishment) of DRDO
- Features- It looks through walls of 20-30cm thickness and it works based on Thermal RADAR technique

Nadda launches CBNAAT machines for quick diagnosis of TB

Union Health Minister JP Nadda launched Cartridge Based Nucleic Acid Amplification Test (CBNAAT) machines for the quick diagnosis of Tuberculosis within two hours.

The CBNAAT is a revolutionary rapid molecular test which detects Mycobacterium tuberculosis and rifampicin drug resistance, simultaneously.

This test is fully automated and provides results within two hours.

Nadda also launched a new anti-TB drug Bedaquiline, which is a new anti-TB drug for treatment of Multi-drug-resistant tuberculosis. This drug is indicated for use in the treatment of drugresistant TB. The drug will be made available in six public hospitals in Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Guwahati and Ahmedabad.

Union environment ministry has notified new plastic waste management rules, The Plastic Waste Management (PWM) Rules 2016, issued will replace the Plastic Waste (Management and Handling) Rules 2011.The ministry also increased the minimum thickness of plastic carry bags from 40 microns to 50 microns.

 The new rules also focus on phasing out of non-recyclable multi layered plastic and



increasing reuse of plastic waste especially in applications like road construction and waste to energy.

Arogya Fair began in Goa

In a move to popularize the Indian medicines with special attention to Ayurveda, Arogya fair is a four day programme is beginning in Goa. The fair is launched as a cooperative effort by AYUSH ministry and Confederation of Indian Industry

The main objective is to popularize the Indian Medicinal system and update the industry with recent developments in the sector

ISRO establishes GIRI radar system in Tirupathi

The Space pioneer of India ISRO has established the Gadanki Ionospheric Radar Interferometer (GIRI) near Tirupati in Andhra Pradesh.

- Located at: National Atmospheric Research Laboratory (NARL) which is an autonomous research institute of the Department of Space
- Construction: It consists of a rectangular • antenna array of 160 two-element Yagiantenna, arranged in a 20×8 matrix, 20 transmitter units, 6 digital receivers including data processing systems, a radar controller, and a host computer

President's rule in Uttarakhand

Capping a nine-day high-voltage political drama, the Centre on Sunday brought Uttarakhand under President's rule citing a constitutional breakdown in the wake of a rebellion in the ruling Congress.

President Pranab Mukherjee signed the proclamation under Article 356 of the Constitution dismissing the Congress government headed by Harish Rawat and placing the Assembly under suspended this animation morning on the recommendation of the Union Cabinet.

Mizoram, JICA sign pact for promoting sustainable agriculture

North-eastern state Mizoram and Japanese International Cooperative Agency signed pact on Capacity Enhancement for Sustainable Agriculture and Irrigation Development.

Training programmes would be conducted in Japan both for officials and farmers from Mizoram for three times during the period and the expenses would be borne by the Japanese government.

- With 919 females for every 1000 males, Gujarat ranked 22nd among 28 states as per the 2011 Census

Mumbai to host BRICS Friendship Cities Conclave in April

The financial capital of India to host BRICS Friendship Cities Conclave in April involving top Urban Policy makers and Planners from BRICS Nations.

• The BRICS Friendship Conclave is a joint initiative of Ministry of External Affairs and Maharashtra Government to be held between April 14 and 16 this year.
